CREATIVE WRITING & ADAPTATIONS

Syrena (full-length screenplay) charts the journey of Syrena, a woman from the sea. Drawn by the sounds of a sinking vessel carrying refugees in a storm, she rescues a drowning woman and they wash up on the shore of an unnamed coast. The survivors are immediately detained and imprisoned in a women's refugee center. As other detainees are attracted and repulsed by Syrena and her mysterious nature, the power of her presence and her song slowly infiltrate the center and its inhabitants, and the urge for escape builds. Currently in development with Midnight Oil Collective at the Yale Tsai Center for Innovation.

Hamlet Sultana (full-length screenplay) is a screenplay written by Elizabeth Dinkova and Robert Knapp for Bardolatry Productions, inspired by Shakespeare's eponymous play. This adaptation takes place in a fictional Islamic empire in the Indian subcontinent around the 1200-1400s, during the conflict between the Turks and Mughals. Hamlet is the daughter of the deceased Sultan, a highly educated woman sent to study in Herat in Afghanistan, brought back for the change in power; she was not considered a viable ruler by her father because of her gender, but was exalted by her mother as a great potential heir. When her father's ghost appears to her seeking revenge, Hamlet embarks on a journey to dismantle entrenched power hierarchies and bring the truth to light. To be produced in 2023.

The Revolutionary is a theatre-film hybrid written with Fahed Altaji. In Season X of The Revolutionary, a competitive reality show, many passionate revolutionaries enter the arena, but only one can come out on top. Rivalries are be formed, romances blossomed; blood, sweat, and tears all shed for the chance to win. But there's more than meets the eye. A reality under the reality. In this show about oppression and rebellion, hope and despair, engagement and apathy, hierarchy and equality, exploitation and liberation, the audience gets to decide the outcome. Devised with the third year acting class and production students at Toronto Metropolitan University (Nov 2021). Directed by Elizabeth Dinkova.

Before the End explores the primordial drive to strive for utopia even as the world around us is falling apart. In this interactive film-theatre experience, conceived by Elizabeth Dinkova and devised with students from Ryerson University, audience members journey through the brightest and darkest corners of human nature, guided by fantasies of a perfect world. This immersion into the life cycles of utopian experiments probes the boundary between culture and cult, individual and community, and creation and destruction. The production premiered at Toronto Metropolitan University (April 2021).

RAGE, a musical adaptation of Stephen King's eponymous novel, in which a writer confronts his responsibility when readers get "inspired" with deadly results, and an act of violence catalyzes emotional revelation among a group of students; book & lyrics by Elizabeth Dinkova, music by Fred Kennedy. The play was workshopped and produced with the students of Quinnipiac University (March 2020) and was a finalist for the RAVE Theater Festival (July 2020, postponed due to COVID-19).

BULGARIA! REVOLT!, is a new folk-rock epic co-created with playwright Miranda Rose Hall and composer Michael Costagliola. A fantasia based on real historical events, this musical begins in 1925, with the jaded Bulgarian poet Geo Milev on the eve of his disappearance; he has written a poem to commemorate a failed peasant revolution and his people's deaths at the hand of the government, but what is a poem good for? When the Devil bursts into his home and tempts him to surrender the poem, the poet and his wife, the idealistic actress Mila, join this mischievous master of ceremonies on a wild ride through a Bulgarian village on the eve of an uprising and an American meat factory on the brink of unionizing to ask: can an artistic act have political significance? Can revolution heal a destitute reality, or

is always doomed to end in bloodshed and corruption? Initially developed and workshopped at the Yale School of Drama (Dec 2016), to be produced at Quinnipiac University (March 2023).

TIT(us), inspired by *Titus Andronicus*, co-written with Jesse Rasmussen. A contemporary musical adaptation about political infighting and finding one's voice in the midst of chaos and divisions. Commissioned, workshopped (Sept 2019), and produced by 7 Sages, Atlanta, GA (as a visual album in Fall 2020 and full production in Fall 2021).

The Gun Show, an interactive experience devised by Elizabeth Dinkova & company, based on interviews with community members and artists about gun culture and legislation, examining views from various ends of the political spectrum to find commonalities. Workshopped at the Alliance Theatre (Dec 2017) and Synchronicity Theatre, Atlanta, GA (Jan 2020).

The Congresswomen, inspired by Aristophanes, a tragicomic musical fantasia about women in power and utopian politics, devised with the students at Queens College; script & lyrics by Elizabeth Dinkova, music by Stew (*Passing Strange*). Produced at Queens College, CUNY (Feb 2019).

The Seagull, a contemporary musical adaptation about the quest to transform the world through art; script & lyrics by Elizabeth Dinkova, music by Anais Azul. Commissioned and produced at Serenbe Playhouse, Serenbe, GA (Sept 2019).

Facebook in Memoriam, devised with Rachel Hynes and Jennifer Restack. An interdisciplinary performance/installation about the digital ghosts that remain when our loved ones pass away. Performed at the Washington, DC Source Festival (June 2014).

The Suede Jacket, adapted from Stanislav Stratiev; an absurdist tragicomedy about personal agency in the midst of socialist bureaucracy (and sheep). Produced at Reed College, Portland, OR (Oct 2013).

The Balance, adapted with Jane Doerflinger from Hans Christian Andersen's *The Story of a Mother*; a play intertwining a mother's fantastical quest to save her child from the clutches of death with an 18th century lunatic asylum patient's journey to process his grief. Produced at Reed College, Portland, OR (Dec 2010).
